South Sudan is the newest nation in the world becoming independent from Sudan on 9th July 2011 following Africa's longest civil war commencing in 1956 when Sudan achieved independence. Unfortunately, independence did not bring conflict in South Sudan to an end. This civil war has resulted in the destruction of much of the infrastructure of South Sudan including schools, colleges and universities, hospitals and health clinics. There is much poverty amongst the general population due to a high level of unemployment.

This situation has led to many South Sudanese seeking asylum and being granted refuge in Australia where they are rebuilding their lives in the midst of a very different and confusing culture. But there are those who remain in South Sudan and refugee camps in Kenya and Uganda without any means of education to be a foundation for this new nation.

You can play the computer game *Sim City* or you can be a part of creating the foundation for a real nation.

Foundation South Sudan Incorporated is a registered charity to provide scholarships for young people in South Sudan to attend university and provide skilled leadership for the building of a foundation for South Sudan.

It is necessary for some students to leave South Sudan and their families to undertake university studies. Therefore, *Foundation South Sudan Incorporated* is working with our partners in the Episcopal Church of South Sudan to identify young men and women in financial hardship, with a commitment to return to South Sudan to be a foundation for this young country and leading a peaceful nation. Selection Criteria

It is impossible to provide sponsorship for all those who are in financial need. The aims of *Foundation South Sudan Incorporated* are to provide resources for those who can become the leaders of South Sudan for the building of the country. Therefore, we intend to prioritise financial assistance to candidates who would study engineering, civic planning, health, teaching, business, economics, political sciences, etc.

Candidates must:

- be in financial hardship, unable to provide for their education from any other sources
- be willing to travel to another neighbouring country if the tertiary institution is not available in South Sudan
- make a commitment to return to, or remain in, South Sudan once they have completed their studies and find, or create, employment in their chosen occupation
- be committed to a South Sudanese national identity over cultural tribal identities
- be accountable to those who oversee their selection to receive assistance for their university education
